

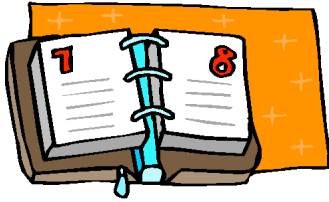
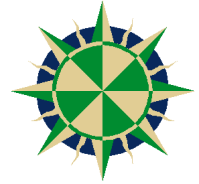

6th & 7th Grade Language Arts: Spelling/ Sentences due Thursday. TEST Thursday.

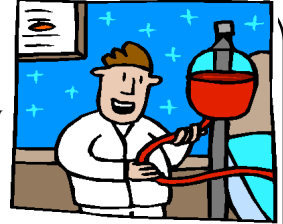

The entire Concord family worked together this past Monday to provide the

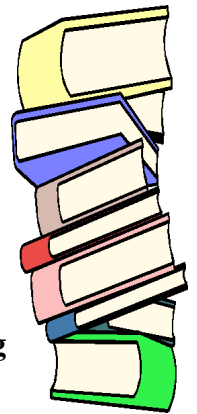
American Red Cross with our blood drive.
